In a very entertaining and enlightening meditation during Lent, Bishop Taylor spoke of the Lenten season as a journey. He wrote, "Our Lenten journey is always to travel closer and closer to the divine, yet like Moses in the wilderness, we are constantly taking our own turns instead of following the highlighted route."

It seems to me that sometimes we try to do everything except stay the course. It causes some confusion for most of us. I caught myself doing just that recently and forced myself to redirect my thoughts and actions back to the mission. Our mission is to restore all people to unity with God and each other in Christ.

Most of us are too busy for our own good these days. It seems that we have more than we can do and at some level that is true. In response, God is calling us to focus on what is holy and life giving in our lives.

Lent calls us to redirect our focus and utilize what energy we have on those things that by God's mercy give life. Instead of chasing down roads that lead nowhere, God calls us to recognize that we are now here and it is in that present moment that God comes alive for us.

Bishop Taylor went on to say, "What matters is that we stay on the journey to home; what matters is that we hold the memory of where home is; what matters is that we put our faith in God's constancy and not in our sinful selves."

Perhaps as we journey toward Easter this Lent, we will resolve to stay focused on the divine. There are many opportunities to do just that. Come to Church on Sunday. Pray for those who are ill in our congregation and don't forget to pray for our confirmands. Spend some time in the soup kitchen or other avenues for servant ministry. Take advantage of other venues for Christian Formation, both locally and on a diocesan level. Make room in your schedule to attend Holy Week Services and the performance by Elisabeth Von Trapp on that Wednesday.

REFLECTIONS ON THE VESTRY RETREAT 2008

To begin with, we were a small group. And that was good. It gave us a chance for true 'togetherness' which doesn't always happen in a big group. For the past two years, fifteen of us jammed into the Farmhouse – (boys upstairs and the girls downstairs). And we literally stuffed ourselves into the modest living room for our learning sessions. This year, because of a cancellation, our small group had the Inn – and all it's spaciousness. It was wonderful. It was also surprisingly snug. We had crackling fires, great food, and lots of fellowship.

Frs. Ferebee and Akridge continued their instruction in the Epiphany Process which seems, after two years, to finally beginning to take hold here at Grace. New ministries are beginning to sprout up from the pews rather than from the pulpit. And this is part of the new paradigm – that you and me are free, and welcomed, to begin new ministries unfettered by cumbersome processes of approval, committees, chains of command and the watchful eyes of a 'big brother' who is standing ready to dictate policy and procedures. No way.

Recent examples of such ministries are the Environmental Concerns Group and the Prayer Shawl Ministry. I would also include the Young Peoples Soup Kitchen Service and the Prayer Group. Are these groups organized? Yes and No. Most have 'point persons'. They may or may not have formal meetings, choosing instead to have activities and events rather than agendas and a non-traditional structure. This allows the group room to grow and evolve. They become fluid and free-forming – open to the Spirit.

As we at Grace, along with numerous other organizations and groups, choose people over structure; purpose over agenda; ministry over tradition; love over power, we will become a people of the New Way. As we become intentional about living into our purpose of being a 'Community of Christ the Servant' your Vestry welcomes "The Community" to step forward into new ministry where God is already present. Your Vestry will support and assist you, but the real epiphany is that you are free to begin what you want to see happen at Grace Church.

- 3) To create a Junior Altar Guild. The minimum age for this Guild would be 14 years of age. Not only would it be an awesome opportunity to learn about preparing the altar but it would be so neat for us to work with this amazing age group.

Well, as you can see, we need volunteers, from age 14 years and older, male (yes, men can prepare the altar) and female, and we are offering you the opportunity to prepare God's table which by far is the most humbling, sacred honor I have ever experienced.

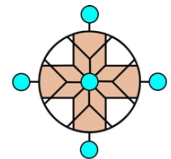
Tickets can be purchased at CoMMA, 401 South College Street, Morganton, NC 28655 or by calling the auditorium's box office at 828-433-7469.
